## **NYC BDQ**

- i) Using the documents and your own knowledge answer the following question: To what extent can urban segregation be discerned in NYC?
- ii) Discuss the values and limitations of the documents in your essay.

Proposed Introduction with arguable thesis statement.

New York (NYC) is the largest city of the megalopolis located in the North East of the USA as identified by the geographer Jean Gottmann in 1961. Spanning five boroughs, Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, Queens and Staten Island this urban agglomeration was home to a population of around 8.8 million inhabitants at the time of the last census (2020). This essay will analyze the issue of segregation in NYC via use of supporting evidence and argues that this phenomenon can be very clearly and obviously discerned across the five boroughs which constitute the city.

## **Essay Plan**
